Pacifism Redefined?
Japan's Security Policy in the Era of Strategic Competition

Japan's new security documents announced in 2022, including the National Security Strategy and its first National Defense Strategy, marked the transformation of Tokyo's security practice. It is now moving toward the possession of counterstrike capabilities and doubling the defense spending—clear departure from the post-war trajectory of self-restraint. But why did these changes occur, and what happened to security policy norms in Japan? To address these questions, this lecture highlighted how domestic norms, the external environment, and the government's policy interacted each other. The analysis suggested that domestic norms, which are often mentioned as a constraint of security policy, are not monolithic: while the shift in the balance of power and external shocks accelerated erosion of antimilitarism, Tokyo has positioned itself as a power maintaining the status quo of the international order amid the U.S.-China competition as well as Russia's unprovoked invasion of Ukraine. The recent policy shift was pushed by emerging norms that champion Japan's responsibility for peace and stability, and this implies that the nature of domestic norms in security affairs is gradually changing from prohibition to a driving force.

2019 年 2 月 14 日、札幌、東京、名古屋、大阪の裁判所で一斉に提訴された後、2019 年 9 月には福岡の裁判所でも始まった「結婚の自由をすべての人に」訴訟は、法律上同性の者との婚姻を認めていない現行民法等の規定の不存在、すなわち、立法不作為の違憲性を正面から問う、日本で初めての訴訟である。2024 年 1 月現在、札幌、東京、名古屋、大阪、福岡の 5 地裁で判決が言い渡された。2021 年に追加提訴した東京 2 次訴訟は、今年 3 月 14 日に判決の予定で、東京 1 次訴訟の東京高裁判決も今年中になされる見込みである。本講演では、主に「結婚の自由をすべての人に」訴訟・東京訴訟の現状と今後について紹介した。

The India - Japan Bilateral Partnership in the Indo-Pacific

The Indo-Pacific has become one of this century's most important strategic concepts and economic regions. With China's rise and the intensification of the U.S.-China rivalry, the region is now witnessing structural shifts that are increasingly affecting its stability and prosperity. The challenge here is that, on the one hand, the region has relied to a huge degree on the U.S. and its regional alliances to uphold security and stability, but on the other hand, its economic prosperity has become deeply intertwined with China.

The India-Japan bilateral partnership has grown significantly over the years and became the "Special Strategic and Global" partnership in 2015. With New Delhi and Tokyo positioned at either end of the Indo-Pacific, this 'like-minded' and deepening partnership has often been championed as one that will take on the role of the region's stabilizing anchors. This workshop was centered around five sessions where scholars addressed, analysed and debated core research questions on the themes of geopolitics, economic and trade relations, maritime security, infrastructure-connectivity projects, and the culture and identity of India and Japan in the Indo-Pacific.
