Summary:

The Indian Subcontinent was divided into two countries in 1947 and later Pakistan was further divided into two countries. Now this region is made up of three countries, Bangladesh, India, and Pakistan. These countries share a long history, but each country has constructed its history, and academics have called it politics of history-making and history writing. These countries also inherited the education system (structures, curricula, and policies) created by the British constructing a certain identity and worldview. This lecture explored how the politics of education shape peace education and attitudes towards peace education in the Indian Subcontinent.
