Outline:

The event was proposed to discuss and disseminate the recent trends in prosody-syntax interface in June 2024. On June 22, Dr. Frank Kügler (U of Frankfurt) shared his work about "On the prosodic expression of focus within complex noun phrases in Finno-Ugric languages", and Dr. Emily Elfner (York University, Toronto) presented "Kwak'wala stress as phrasal prominence". Both talks covered new proposals concerning how prominence in phrasal phonology is realized in understudied languages. These talks were presented as part of the spring meeting of the phonological society of Japan.

On June 24, an IERS symposium was held with the following presentations: Frank Kügler (University of Frankfurt) "Prosodic phrasing and phrase-level ATR harmony in Anum", Emily Elfner (York University) "MATCH constraints and syntax-prosody mapping in (some) polysynthetic languages", and "Haruo Kubozono (NINJAL) "Prosodic phrasing and syntax-prosody mapping in Japanese compounds". The three talks were preceded by an opening introduction of the syntax-prosody interface theories by Seunghun Lee (ICU). This event is sponsored by Dr. Seunghun Lee and Dr. Tomoyuki Yoshida.

Outcome:

This event offered venues for ICU students, faculty as well as the greater research community in and around Tokyo. ICU students are exposed to modularized view of languages, and this workshop exposed them to research ideas that aim to see the connection between the two modules (syntax and prosody). Hosting the events at ICU draw participation from various institutions in and out of Japan.
