The 5th Asia Graduate School of Education Forum (2008)

Theme: “New Challenges in Higher Education in Asia with particular attention to Teaching & Learning, E-Transformation, Management & Policy, and Quality Issue”

Venue: International Christian University (ICU), Tokyo, Japan

Dates: 20 – 21 November, 2008

Organizers: Institute for Educational Research and Service (IERS) and the Graduate School of Education (GSE)

Background: The GSE Forum is an academic forum specifically designed for graduate students. It aims to promote research in higher education and to build academic networks among GSE programs in Asian universities. During the first two years, the GSE Forum was a special venue exclusively for GSE students and faculty from ICU, Japan and Seoul National University (SNU), Korea to share research ideas and outcomes and discuss education reform issues in Japan and Korea. From the third year, it began to involve GSE students from other universities including the Tokyo Gakugei University (TGU, Japan) and the University of Philippines (UP, Philippines). The 4th GSE Forum, which was held in conjunction with the SNU Education Research Institute’s International Conference on Education Research (ICER) in 2007, invited GSE faculty and students from China, Philippines and Japan as well as from ICU and SNU.

Based on previous experiences and accomplishments, IERS and GSE of ICU organized the 5th 2008 GSE Forum and changed its name from the ICU-SNU GSE Forum to the Asian GSE Forum to steadily extend its reach to GSE programs in other Asian countries.

Purposes: The 5th Asian GSE Forum aimed:

- To provide GSE students and faculty with the opportunity to develop a deeper and wider understanding of the educational changes and reform efforts in Asian higher education.
- To encourage GSE students and faculty to develop and share research ideas and present these in a professional manner.
- To provide GSE students and faculty with a research framework to inform, encourage and support educational innovations employing ICT.
- To further develop a collaborative network among GSE programs in Asia.
- To publish high quality papers from the Forum in the IERS journal, Educational Studies.

Theme and topics: The 2008 Forum focused on “New Challenges in Higher Education in Asia with particular attention to Teaching & Learning, E-Transformation, Management & Policy, and Quality Issue” .

The scope of the Forum included, but was not limited to, the following topics:

- Pedagogical issues --- the needs and opportunities for, and barriers to, new teaching and learning methodologies and applying instructional design and advanced technologies across various study fields.
- Technological issues --- selecting and combining the most appropriate technologies; learning management systems; learning objects; open-source software and mobile technologies.
- Management and Policy issues --- the leadership, management, policy-making, resource provision and partnership needed to bring changes to higher education.
- Quality issues --- faculty development and support systems; quality assurance systems; new emerging types of organization.
- Trends issues --- trends in technology and statistical processes employed either in education or in the world at large; and trends in movies in Asia and how it influences various cultural perspectives and collaboration.

Participants: There were over forty participants from several Asian countries (China, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Singapore and the Philippines).
